Definitions

TUTOR

: a person charged with the instruction and guidance of another: as a private teacher

HEIR

1 : one who inherits or is entitled to inherit property

2 : one who inherits or is entitled to succeed to a hereditary rank, title, or office <*heir* to the throne>

3 : one who receives or is entitled to receive some endowment or quality from a parent or predecessor

SERVANT

: one that [serves](#) others; *especially* : one that performs duties about the person or home of a master or personal employer

REPLENISH

1 a : to fill with persons or animals : [STOCK](#) **b** *archaic* : to supply fully : [PERFECT](#) **c** : to fill with inspiration or power : [NOURISH](#)

2 a : to fill or build up again **b** : to make good : [REPLACE](#): to become full : fill up again

SCRIPTURES REFERENCES:**Galatians 4:1-7**

¹Now I say, That the heir, as long as he is a child, differeth nothing from a servant, though he be lord of all;

²But is under tutors and governors until the time appointed of the father.

³Even so we, when we were children, were in bondage under the elements of the world:

⁴But when the fulness of the time was come, God sent forth his Son, made of a woman, made under the law,

⁵To redeem them that were under the law, that we might receive the adoption of sons.

⁶And because ye are sons, God hath sent forth the Spirit of his Son into your hearts, crying, Abba, Father.

³Jesus answered and said unto him, Verily, verily, I say unto thee, Except a man be born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God.

⁴Nicodemus saith unto him, How can a man be born when he is old? can he enter the second time into his mother's womb, and be born?

⁵Jesus answered, Verily, verily, I say unto thee, Except a man be born of water and of the Spirit, he cannot enter into the kingdom of God.

⁶That which is born of the flesh is flesh; and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit.

⁷Marvel not that I said unto thee, Ye must be born again.

⁸The wind bloweth where it listeth, and thou hearest the sound thereof, but canst not tell whence it cometh, and whither it goeth: so is every one that is born of the Spirit.

NOTES

3 Classes of People

1. Those who are saved, but don't know it.

These type of people are in the process of being taught their royal position, however, they don't know how to take their dominion yet.

2. Those who are saved and know it.

3. Those who are not saved and think they are.

They believe, but the Lord must help their unbelief.

- It's not abnormal to love God and still yield to the desires of the heart, but when you get an audience with the Father, He begins to show you who you are and whose you are. There is a Word that cannot fail. God is simply waiting for the runway of your mind to clear in order to make His landing.
- As long as an heir is a child, he or she is no different from a slave—until the time appointed by the father.
- You can't see the kingdom with your secular thinking. Flesh gives birth to flesh. Nicodemus, a member of the governors taught and tutored the priests, but he was born of the flesh and not of the spirit. (John 3) You can't see the kingdom with your secular thinking. Flesh gives birth to flesh.
- *Children, obey your parents in the Lord: for this is right.* (Ephesians 6:1) Make sure, as a tutor, that you have an audience with God so that you can prepare your children to take dominion.
